- Ask your child to share with you what he or she is learning in class.
- Contact the team teachers with any questions or concerns via email, a nate in the planner, or phone call.
- Restock your child's school supplies as needed.
- Check ASPEN often to see your child's progress in each class.
- Check your email regularly for classroom emails regarding upcoming assignments and activities.

School Supply Shopping List



Organization is an ongoing issue for many middle school students. As a team we feel it is up to the individual student to find their own organizational style; therefore, there are no set requirements with regards to binders and notebooks for their academic classes.

The required binders are two binders, a 1-1/2 (for math) and a 3-inch that will hold the student school-provided daily planner, two folders, and some subjects. Three spiral notebooks are also required, two single-subject and one three-subject.

Please take some time this summer to discuss organizational strategies with your student and find one that best works for them. All team teachers will be more than happy to assist with this process as well at the start of the school year.

Students are required to have a regularly stocked supply of the following:

- Pencils (required for all classes)
- <u>Erasers</u> (block or pencil toppers)
- Blue, black, and red pens
- Highlighters
- Pencil pouch—helpful for keeping all of the above items handy while at school
- Dividers (one pack)
- Loose leaf paper (4pkg—leave 3 at home)
- Index cards for Social Studies
- 3 spiral notebooks—1 each for math and science (both single subject) and 1 for Spanish with 3 sections
- Book Covers: Brown paper bags are the best book covers. No Book Sox or adhesive covers, please.
- Two binders: a 1 1/2 inch binder—for math (the math books will go into the binder) and a 3-inch for the planner, homework folders, and some subjects.
- 2 homework folders with holes.
- Dry erase markers and a calculator are recommended for math.
- A set of ear buds/headphones


NOTE: Students are <u>not</u> permitted to have Sharpie-type permanent markers at school. PLEASE DO NOT PURCHASE THEM.



STUDENT PLANBOOK

A planbook/agenda will be provided by VCMS; you will not need to purchase one. The planbook is a valuable resource for students, parents, and teachers. Students need to write their assignments in their planbook each block and should bring it home each day so you can monitor assignments and read any communication from the teachers. If your child loses or destroys the planner, a new one must be purchased for \$5.00 from the main office.
