Your support matters so much for kids like Brooke, who was diagnosed with a very aggressive cancer, stage IV high risk neuroblastoma, when she was just 4 years old. Always energetic, Brooke had begun limping, and soon her leg pain became unbearable. Her family was shocked when she was diagnosed with cancer. Brooke underwent grueling treatment including many rounds of chemotherapy, surgeries and radiation. Though she lost a significant amount of hearing as a side effect of her treatment, she and her family were thrilled that her cancer went into remission. Unfortunately, two years later they received the devastating news that she had relapsed. Brooke is now 10, and like many kids who have relapsed, her hopes lie in new and more effective therapies being developed quickly.

Since its inception, Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation has raised more than \$127 million dollars to fund 650 childhood cancer research projects at more than 100 top hospitals and research centers in the United States and Canada. With generous contributions from donors like you, we are able to speed up the pace of research, develop new ways of treating kids like Brooke and bring those new therapies to the clinic. These advances allow more kids to have a healthy childhood, enjoy life without cancer and grow up to adulthood, and your compassion is making a difference.
